



TODAY'S RACE MEETING

As you will see from the following pages, the programme for today is as varied as ever, both with regard to the cars competing and to the types of event on offer.

The High Speed Trial, before lunch, is an unusual event in that competitors are required to complete a preset number of laps. This target is based on their potential performance and practice times. This year's trial also sees the return to the presentation of the International Police Association Trophy details of which are described opposite the entry list for the event.

The Scratch Races are straightforward 10 lap events with each race consisting of cars with similar performance and the first car across the finish line is the winner.

Held over seven laps, the Handicap Races can sometimes be a little confusing to spectators. The basic idea is to offset the performance of one car against another by awarding a starting allowance - thus the theoretically fastest cars start last and the slower cars start up to one minute earlier. This can be very exciting as the slower cars will have almost completed their first lap just as the faster cars are starting.

In a perfect situation the entire field should cross the finishing line together, fortunately, this rarely happens.

AWARDS

In addition to their main award each High Speed Trial driver who complete their target number of laps will receive a 'First Class' award whilst those within one lap of their target will receive a 'second class' award.

Perpetual Awards are presented to the first 3 drivers in each Handicap and Scratch Race.

Team Awards are presented to the winning team in the Inter-Club Team Handicap Race at the end of the day.

On behalf of the Organising Committee, I hope you have a very enjoyable day's Motor Sport at Silverstone.





I.P.A. HIGH SPEED TROPHY

The association has grown so vast, particularly in Europe, enabling sections in Germany, Holland, Italy and England to acquire fine properties such as Hunting Lodges, Castles, Houses and Caravans, being bought or donated to the I.P.A. and used as holiday homes and conference centres for its members, thus furthering the Service through Friendship on which it is based.

It was the enthusiasm and friendship of an I.P.A. member in 1967 who joined the Association with the 'Motor Sport world, establishing the link with the Eight Clubs, therefore adding a significant contribution to Police and Public relations.

On 3rd June 1967 the president of the I.P.A., Sir Peter Matthews presented a trophy to Eight Clubs president, Barclay Inglis. This is now known as the "I.P.A. High Speed Trophy", and significantly was won in that year by John Gott, then Chief Constable of Northamptonshire and loyal I.P.A. member, who died shortly after winning this event.

In recognition of the friendship of past members of both the I.P.A. and Eight Clubs we meet today, and for the first time in many years the driver who best improves upon his target will receive the trophy in a pit lane presentation at approx 13.00.

We hope this event may continue for years to come. To you, the Competitors, you are racing for a unique trophy of which there is no other in the world: we wish you every success.


Mr Neville Heath



THE EIGHT CLUBS

One of the social effects of the second World War was to introduce the widest possible cross section of the public to the potential pleasures of the car. When hostilities were over, this new enthusiasm quickly found its fulfilment in the formation of many motor clubs and thence to a desire for competition. However, the running of a full blown race meeting was something few of the fledgling clubs, or most of their older one-make brethren for that matter, could contemplate. So, some 5 years after the outbreak of peace, representatives of 8 motor clubs, all based in central southern England, met under the Chairmanship of a certain Holland Birkett to form an Association for the sole purpose of organising a race meeting for the combined membership. This, it was resolved, should include non-competitive high speed trials and should seed competitors for scratch as well as handicap races.

On 3 June, 1950, the first of the series of Silverstone Race meetings took place and, apart from a brief flirtation with rallying (Eight Clubs Eastbourne Rally), and a second race meeting for a few years at Lydden, the Association has run one race meeting each year at Silverstone ever since.

Very few changes in the composition of the Association have occurred over the years. The only withdrawal, in the 1950s, was Lagonda CC, while the Combined One Make CC, itself an association of more than 20 Clubs, Herts County A&AeC and Lloyds MC have joined since.

Holland Birkett was the inspiration of four projects which have been going strongly for over 40 years:- the Eight Clubs, the Six Hour Relay Race, the 750 Formula and the 1172 (now 1300) Formula. Races for the 2 latter are still an integral part of Eight Clubs race meetings today.

Glancing through an old programme, one notes that there were 2 one hour high speed trials and that the last event - out of no less than 16 - started at 7.45 pm. Advertisements showed Motor and Autocar at 5p apiece and Autosport expensive at 7½p! It is, however, not only costs that have changed since then. Legislative and other pressures have taken their toll. There is now only one high speed trial of 20 minutes and the last race has to be started soon after 5 pm. Even so, the annual meeting at Silverstone still shows a wider field of racing machinery than you will find anywhere else and still includes seeded scratch and handicap races as well as the high speed trial and Formula races.

We hope that, whether as competitor, helper or spectator, you will enjoy today's event just as much as did those pioneers of nearly fifty years ago.
