## PADDOCK GOSSIP

## A brief round-up of some of the latest motor racing news

Jacquie Bond-Smith and Joey Cook are two sisters who are due to be racing here today. Mrs Bond-Smith has a Lotus 23B, while sister Joey will be driving father Arthur's special 'Wavendon Wombat'. A few seasons back Jaquie drove this car before graduating to saloons with first a Lotus-Cortina which rolled at this circuit - and then a Ford Galaxie, with which she scored a success in the Snetterton 500 Kilometres ace in 1965. Now she appears in the Dickens Cup race at the wheel of a sports-racing Lotus, and will be racing against younger sister Joey who has already put in several good drives with the venerable Wombat

Lola Cars have produced an exciting new coupe for long-distance racing this year based on their sports-racing T70 models which have been a familiar sight around the circuits in the past. The new car, designated the T70 Mark 3, may be fitted with either open or closed bodies to customer's choice, but the coupe will be the more extensively raced in Europe this year. A 5.5 litre Chevrolet V8 engine producing 460 bhp is fitted as standard but works cars, several of which have been entered for the Le Mans 24 Hours race, may use a new Aston Martin V8 racing engine if tests prove satisfactory. This could give us an all-British potential Le Mans winner for the first time in years. The coupes are said to be capable of 200 mph , and the BOAC 500 mile race at Brands Hatch on July 30 is typical of the type of event in which they will run. Drivers will include John Surtees, Denny Hulme, Pedro Rodriguez, David Hobbs, Hugh Dibley and Mike de Udy.

1,600 cc Formula 2 makes its world debut in the Guards 100 International at Snetterton circuit in Norfolk on Good Friday, March 24. Cars for the new category are being extensively tested at the moment, and the four-cylinder production-based power units are showing phenomenal power - Cosworth getting circa 230 bhp from their FVA unit and BMW - whose engine is fitted in a new Lola T100 chassis - have had figures of something like 144 bhp per litre! All the top name drivers have been
invited to the Snetterton meeting, including World Champions Jack Brabham and John Surtees in Brabham, and Lola cars respectively. What with this race and the opening of the European FI season, the Daily Mail Race of Champions at Brands on March 12, it looks like be ing a hectic month
Chris Irwin, the most successful of last year's Formula 3 drivers, has won a BRM Formula seat for this year, but has gone up in the world in one other way as well. He has just bought a private aircraft, previously owned by Jack Brabham. Flying GP drivers now include Brabham, the current World Champion Jim Clark, Graham Hill, Mike Parkes and Irwin.

Italian works teams now seem to be staffed mainly by English drivers. Last year Jonathan Williams and Boley Pittard worked for de Sanctis and BWA respectively, Mike Parkes has been with Ferrari for several years, and now Chris Craft has gone over to BWA in place of Pittard who has gone to Tecno. Williams has won a place at Ferrari alongside has won a place at Ferrari alongside
Parkes, and it has been said that Mike Beckwith may take his place at de Beckwith
Sanctis.

Probably the most powerful car here to today is Jim Moore's Kincraft-Cobra single-seater, entered for the Formule Libre race. Fitted with a 4.7 litre Ford V8 engine, the car was originally built by Jack Pearce in 1965. He was doing very well in the car until an unfortunate crash in Eire decided him to retire from the sport, and the Kincraft largely lay idle until late in the year when John Hine had a win with it here at Brands Hatch For 1966 it was sold to one of the racing Bridges brothers from Chester, and had a few successes before going to Robin Darlington early in the season. He had many Formula Libre wins with the car in the north, before hitting a tree with it at Oulton Park in the Autumn. Darlington, a driver much improved by his experiences with the Kincraft, then invested in a Lola T70 sport-racer, and Jim Moore, a Croydon garagist and speed shop proprietor, bought the car. He was a successful Libre exponent two seasons back and could do well again today.

## 1967 A Year for the Clubs and the Clubmen?

This, the Rochester Chatham and District Motor Club's first track event of 1967, sets the club off on another crowded season of motor sport, almost as comprehensive as the Brands Hatch Circuit calendar itself. The comparison is, in fact, very apt, for it is at this circuit that we will be organising, either in part or wholly, more than 20 meetings of all types. They range from Clubman, National and International Motorcycle Racing to the very popular "Different" sport of Stock Car Racing which takes place on the special oval using part of Clearways. Later in the year we will be organising our Autumn Cup Races, again at this circuit, a meeting which was received very well last November.

Today the racing is mainly for Clubmen. Very often these competitors, the backbone of the sport, have trouble getting their entries accepted, as organisers generally choose the "Names" at their expense. This meeting however, set out to accept novices and beginners BEFORE the better known drivers were admitted. The presence of newcomers on the grid gives everyone a unique opportunity to do some talent spotting, for who can say that we are not seeing some future Grand Prix star at the earliest point in his career?

Whether you are competing, marshalling or spectating, we hope that you will enjoy a very pleasant day of Motor Racing. We would particularly like to take this opportunity to thank the St. John Ambulance Brigade, the marshals and the suppliers of the excellent course cars.
