## Saloons and sports cars head quality championships entry

Points are at stake in some of this season's most hotly-contested club championships today, so the Rochester Motor Club should be rewarded with some close and exciting races in the busy eight-race programme it has organised for our entertainment.
It makes quite a change to report that for once the Formula Fords do not dominate the entry. That honour goes to the saloons contesting the HepoliteGlacier Championship, which have three races, but today's meeting gets its title from the Shell Clubman's Formula Championship event, which brings all the best of these fast and exciting little sports cars back to Kent.
Last time here, the Clubman's cars produced their usual drama, with pole position man Noel Stanbury having to make a pit stop with plug trouble and Vernon Davies spinning his chances away a second after he grabbed the lead on the way up to Druids on the last lap. All this left Geoff Friswell to win once again in his Mallock U2. This is something he has been doing with great regularity, so much so that he leads the large capacity class in the championship with ease and heads the overall points table jointly with Melvyn Coon from the 1,000 cc class.
These four drivers are all here again, and although Friswell must be one of the favourites, he can't be too confident of all the luck going his way like it did last time. In addition to Stanbury and Davies, further strong competition comes from Barry Foley in the St. Bruno, Malcolm Jackson's Alexis and Rob Cochran's Bladon.
In the smaller class, Melyvn Coon's Dino is clearly superior to the opposition and he has won the class at seven of the eight championship rounds held so far. Martin White has been second or third to Coon six times and won the class on the only occasion when Coon blotted his copybook, so we can look for another good performance from him. These two have 35 and 26 points respectively in the
championship, and no other driver in the class has yet reached double figures. The saloons always provide good entertainment, and there should be enough fun and games to keep everyone happy in today's three Hepolite-Glacier races. The unimited chas has been rather in the doldrums this year, but the lure of championship points has brought two of the best club saloons down here today. The two are Mick Hill's V8 Boss Capri and Colin Hawker's spotless Escort V6. There's not much to say about the magnificent Capri which has not been said before, but results speak for themselves, and Mick leads the championship with six wins and a third, which he achieved in the wet here in March.
Brands Hatch is not Mick's luckiest circuit, the Capri being much more at home where it has more room to stretch its legs, and Colin Hawker won the last Hepolite-Glacier round here on May 21, so he might be the man to beat again on this occasion. Doc Merfield's Cortina Climax V8 is also down to race, but this car appears on the entry lists more often than on the track, so we shall have to wait and see.
These big bangers share a race with the $1,300 \mathrm{cc}$ class, so there will be plenty of quick Minis around to take advantage of any slips by the big boys. Bob Fox leads the class, but there are several drivers who could beat him, among them Brian Cox, Alan Shaw, Mo Mendham and Paul Hutton.
The two smaller classes enjoy a race each. Mike Evans has proved virtually unbeatable among the 850s this season, but Graham Janzen is always the man to eat here, and Will Lawrence also goes amazingly quickly for an 850 car. Graham Lloyd should be among the front-runners, his Mini powered by the only Foru engine in the race.
Saloons in the 850-1,000 cc class have produced some of the best racing in the past, and today's event should be no exception. Ray Calcutt fields the Kent Messenger Imp again, but equally quick Imps will be in the hands of Jeff Ward and John Homewood, and this should ensure a stirring battle. Geoff Lynn has yet another Imp and Mike Beckett's Anglia is tremendously fast, and if victory does not go to one of these five, people like Peter Baldwin, Mo Mendham, Terry and Paul Harmer and David Hipperson will be there to press home the Mini challenge.
Ward and Homewood have already won Hepolite-Glacier races here this year, and Calcutt's Brands Hatch successes are well known, so this should truly be a race to remember.

Points are also at stake in the STP Championship for modified sports cars. Two of the leading protagonists this afternoon will be Ted Worswick in his fearsome V8 TVR Tuscan and Jon Fletcher's more scientific Lotus Elan. These two had a good dice here on Easter Monday, and they look all set to carry on where they left off on that day. Both are predictable class winners, and so is Brian Hough, who drives a V6 Tuscan.
Consistent success has taken these three to the top of their respective classes in the championship, but the man who leads the smallest class, lan Hall (Sprite) is not likely to beat the opposition today. A very strong favourite must be Barry Wood in the works Ginetta G15. Another G15 is entered for Alison Davis, and three older G4 models are also on the list, so Hall will really have his work cut out.
Talking of strong favourites, Richard Robarts looks like a good bet for victory in the Medway Trophy Race for Formula Fords. His Elden will line up with a grid full of Brands Hatch regulars and a couple of notable entries, the Merlyn of Sonny Eade, who had a season in Formula 3 last year, and David Morgan's brother Richard in a Lotus 61.
Longest race on the programme is the 20-lapper for the Rochester Trophy, a Formule Libre event in which anything goes. Mick Jones in his Formula Atlantic Merlyn entered by the Kentish Times is a likely winner of this one, but lurking further down the entry list is Malcolm Club's 4.7 litre McLaren sports car. However, all those litres will take a lot of taming on the tight club circuit and the smaller and more nimble machinery must start with a better chance.
Philip Guerola's Brabham BT21B cannot be overlooked, but the real surprises are likely to come from some of the quick Clubman's Formula cars, out for their second race of the day.
Last but not least, the noisy and spectacular Formula Vees are due for another round of their championship. The races are almost always dramatic to watch, but the Formula has never quite caught on in this country, presumably because of the popularity of Formula Ford. However, the Vees have an enthusiastic band of regular drivers and today's entry is in fact well oversubscribed. Leading contenders Graham Meek, Martin Thompson, Martin Woodman, Keith Hollamby and Gordon Rae are all here today, so the racing should be up to its usual hetic standard.

## Formula Vee Championship

Formula Vee is the worlds largest and least expensive single seater racing formula and is run in Gt. Britain by The Formula Vee Association.
Vee racing has its origins in the Volkswagen Beetle range of Saloons. Modifications to the original Volkswagen parts are strictly limited so that cost can be kept down to an absolute minimum. Because of this a race winning car can be provided for under $£ 1,000$.
Apart from keeping the costs down, the tuning restrictions have ensured that the racing is always extremely close, thereby giving the participants some of the best value for money in modern Motor Racing.
The series has 15 rounds of which the best 12 races count.
Points are scored on a Grand Prix basis, ie., 9, 6, 4, 3, 2, 1. The prize money for each race is 1 st. $£ 20,2$ nd. $£ 10,3$ rd. $£ 8,4$ th $£ 6$, 5 th. $£ 4$, 6 th. $£ 2$.
At the end of the season $£ 100$ is awarded to the top driver plus a trophy. $£ 50$ is given to the second place man, plus a trophy and third place receives $£ 25$ and a trophy. All the awards are forwarded to the competitors by the Association in the week following the race which ensures that some of their race expenses are recovered.

Shell is continuing its sponsorship of Clubman's Formula racing in 1972 through a 16 -round championship worth a total of $£ 1800$. There are two classes-up to 1000 cc and $1001-1600 \mathrm{cc}$-and the smaller capacity class will be for the Gregor Grant Championship in honour of the well-known motoring journalist.
Points in each class are allocated on the basis of $5,4,3,2$ and 1 to the first five finishers. A driver's best 15 performances count towards his championship total. ## STP <br> Modified Sports Car Championship

Link Hampson Ltd, the British distributors for STP, is sponsoring a champion ship for modified sports cars for the third year in succession. It follows the same pattern, but the prize money has been stepped up by nearly $50 \%$
There are 16 qualifying rounds and a driver's best 15 scores count towards his championship total. There are four capacity classes-up to $1150 \mathrm{cc}, 1150-2000 \mathrm{cc}$ 2001-3000 cc and over 3000 cc-and points are allocated on the basis of 12, 9 and 6 for the first three places in each class, with double points for the final round. Prize money per race will be $£ 18, £ 12$ and $£ 8$ in each class, so that if there are three finishers in each class the race purse will be $£ 152$ (compared with $£ 108$ in 1971). The winner of the championship will receive $£ 100$ with the winners in the other three classes getting $£ 50$.
Future qualifying rounds: Brands Hatch: July 30, August 13 and October 15 Mallory Park: August 6 and October 8; Oulton Park: July 8 and September 30; Snetterton: August 28 and October 29; Rufforth: July 1; Thruxton: August 27.


## HEPOLITE-GLACIER <br> Saloon Car Championship

The very popular Hepolite-Glacier Saloon Car Championship, sponsored by AE Auto Parts, of Bradford, which provided such good racing during 1971, is to continue in 1972 with the prize money increased by $£ 1000$
There are 20 qualifying races, with a driver's best 16 scores counting towards his total For 1972 there are four capacity classes with the addition of a category for up to 850 cc ; the other classes are $851-1000 \mathrm{cc}, 1001-1300 \mathrm{cc}$ and over 1300 cc . Points are allocated on the basis of 9 for a class win, 6 for second in class and 4 for third in class, with double points for the final round on October 15.
Prize money in each qualifying round is paid at the rate of $£ 2$ per point, which means $£ 18, £ 12$ and $£ 8$ in each class and a total race purse of $£ 152$. (The same prize money will be paid for the final, double-point round.)
The overall winner of the championship receives $£ 200$, while the winners of the other classes will get $£ 72$ each. Second place in all classes is worth $£ 40$, third place $£ 25$, fourth place $£ 15$ and fifth place $£ 10$. This brings the, total pay-out for the championship to more than $£ 3800$.
