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

Single-seater thrills the highlight of all-championship meeting by Brian Phillips

Today's championship meeting organized by the BRSCC has all the makings of a classic. The organizers have brought together many of the best club racing drivers in the country, and we have the prospect of some truly memorable moments in the most fiercely-contested racing classes to be found anywhere.

Many enthusiasts, and I number myself among them, consider that Formula 3 has provided consistently the best racing to be seen at any level in this country in recent years, apart from a brief period when the new 1,600 cc formula was getting off the ground, and the Lombard North Central Championship qualifier should provide a fitting highlight today.

Single-seater fans are exceptionally well catered for. The Formula Atlantic boys are here again for another of their noisy confrontations, and the Formula Fords will be out in their usual force for a total of three races.

Spectators who don't consider single-seater races to be the best usually go for the saloons, and today the Hepolite-Glacier Championship brings all the leading points-chasers to the grid, including one of the best gatherings of 'big-banger' unlimited saloons seen for quite a while.

The Formula 3 battle brings out, among others, several local heroes who are sure to get lots of popular support. Among them is Andy Sutcliffe, enjoying his best ever season now he has been signed by the GRD team. Andy leads the championship quite comfortably thanks to a string of wins at the start of the season, but luck has not been going so much his way since then.

Iberia Team Ensign driver Rikki von Opel is second in the table, and third is Tony Brise from Dartford, who is really making his mark in Formula 3 after all his Formula Ford successes last year. Tony was unlucky not to score points here on Ford Sport Speed Day after driving unscathed through a multiple accident on the first lap, only to spin off moments later.

Also on the list is Tom Pryce, who lives almost literally a stone's throw from the track. If he is back to full fitness, this will be his first Brands Hatch appearance since he broke a leg at Monaco last month. Tom drives the works Royale with which he scored such a resounding win at the Race of Champions meeting.

To list all the likely front-runners would take too much space, but watch out for Peter Hull and Alan Jones (Brabhams). Russell Wood (March), Ian Ashley

(Royale), Chris Skeaping (Chevron) and Bev Bond in the Ehrlich. An interesting entry is the March-based Lenham Hurst LM1 for one of last year's Formula Ford discoveries, the young Kent driver Richard Croucher.

The Formula Atlantics are due for another round of the excellent Yellow Pages Championship, and one can only hope that there will be no more squabbles over engine illegality. American Bill Gubelmann was delighted to beat his Brands Hatch 'jinx' when he won here last time out and he must be a favourite in his March. Cyd Williams in another March was challenging hard for the lead at the last Yellow Pages race before he was black flagged out of contention, so he is sure to be out for a 'revenge' victory.

All the other top men are here. People like Robert Salisbury in the Bob Gerard Brabham, John Nicholson, who has at last scored a win to go with all his other high placings in the Lyncar, John Lepp in Bob Howlings' Chevron, Peter Wardle (ART Lotus), and the Tate of Leeds pair Chris Meek and Malcolm Wayne, who are again listed to drive the elusive Taydecs.

Newcomers to the formula are Sonny Rajah (March), famous for his formule libre exploits out in the Far East, and Alan McCully, who has brought his AIRO Brabham up from the Formula 3 ranks. Alan Rollinson is down to drive the McKechnie Puma, and Mick Jones, although outclassed by the latest machinery, comes here today confident after a record-shattering libre win with the Kentish Times Merlyn two weeks ago.

Dick Barker is entered again in the Brabham which got him on to several front pages after the Bank Holiday meetings, and let us finally spare a thought for another unlucky driver, Ronnie Mackay. He lives in the far north of Scotland, and he travelled down here on May 28 only to be pushed off the grid literally at the last minute because he was first reserve. On his previous visit he had a moment on the first lap which put him out. Let's hope for his sake things go better today.

The younger half of the dynamic Dartford duo, Tim Brise, has headed the BOC Formula Ford Championship right from the start. Today's race is the twelfth in the series and he has been coming under stronger and stronger pressure as the weeks go by. Tim lost his winning touch when he switched from his own special Merlyn to an Elden. Now he is back in the Merlyn and no doubt hoping

to see the chequered flag a few more times.

The experienced Ian Taylor (Dulon) is the man who has been making things so difficult for Tim and both drivers are here again. A serious candidate for victory must also be Derek Lawrence, who does not race in all the BOC rounds but always goes well when he does. Donald Macleod was a surprise winner here on May 28 and followed that up with a third the next day, so he cannot be overlooked.

Nor can plenty of other eager candidates. Robert Arnott, David Ferris, David Loring, Robert Cooper (Merlyns), Buzz Buzaglo, Danny Sullivan, Mike Catlow (Eldens) and Mike Taylor (Palliser), to name but a few. The BOC qualifier is split into two ten-lap heats and a final of 20 laps, and they just have to be exciting.

The Hepolite-Glacier saloons look like being rather overshadowed by all the open-wheeler excitement, but saloon fans will certainly not be disappointed with the line-up, particularly in the race for the larger capacity classes.

The entry is headed by three monsters, and the one with the smallest engine is Mick Hill's magnificent Boss Capri, looking better than ever in its Luton Motors Group colours. Mick is storming away with the championship and it's hard to see anyone getting near him, but Chris Meek and the Tate of Leeds 5.7 litre Escort have been threatening to appear for some time now, so let us hope today's the day. Martin Kent handles the other giant, a Sunbeam Rapier with a 5.3 litre engine.

Colin Hawker is due to drive his V6 Escort again, and Gill Fortescue-Thomas has a two-litre Escort which looks positively puny beside all the heavy metal. Down in the 1300 class things should be just as dramatic, with Geoff Wood's amazing Mini-Ford facing up to the more conventional cars of Bob Fox, Terry Harmer, Alan Shaw, Rob Mason and Paul Hutton or Bob Jones.

The other Hepolite-Glacier race caters for the small classes, with Jeff Ward and Graham Janzen the likely class winners, but not without an almighty struggle.

Critics have complained that special saloon car racing at club level has been killed by the arrival of hybrid machines like Mick Hill's and Geoff Wood's, but watch and listen when Mick unleashes all those hairy horses down the Top Straight and you might agree with me that it's worth going a long way to see such cars.



BP Man of the Meeting awards continue on bigger scale

The 1971 B.P. Superman was the brilliant young Leicestershire driver Roger Williamson, who Won the Lombard North Central Formula 3 championship and was chosen as No. 1 Grovewood Award winner.

The BP Man of the Meeting awards, which proved such a success during 1971, are being continued this season on an increased scale, and are proving just as popular.

The number of awards has been increased from 14 to 20-eight at Brands Hatch, four each at

Mallory Park and Oulton Park, and two each at Snetterton and Silverstone.

Winners of the awards are picked by a judging panel of motor racing journalists, plus Harry Downing, who is in charge of BP's motor sport activities. A BP Man of the Meeting is not necessarily a race winner, but a driver who, in the opinion of the panel, produces an outstanding performance bearing in mind the car he is driving and the strength of the opposition. Each award winner receives a trophy, a rally jacket and petrol vouchers, and at the end of the season the judges will decide which Man of the Meeting should have the title of BP Superman of the Year, who will receive a special award, an oil painting.

Harry Downing comments: 'The BP Man of the Meeting awards were initiated to give encouragement to young drivers at an early stage in their careers, by drawing public attention to their efforts and providing them with some real incentive. We were delighted with the response to the first year's series, and this is why the Man of the Meeting scheme, was extend-

ed for 1972.

B.O.C. Formula Ford Championship

The British Oxygen Company, which backed a successful Formula Ford championship during 1971, is again sponsoring a series in 1972.

There are 20 qualifying rounds, for which a driver's best 15 results count towards his championship points total. Points are allocated on the basis of 9, 6, 4, 3, 2 and 1 to the first six finishers in each race, with double points for the final round to be staged at Brands Hatch on October 15.

The winner of the championship will receive £100 and the BOC Golden Helmet Trophy. There will be £75 for the runner-up and £50 for 3rd place.

Prize money in each qualifying round is paid at the rate of £4 per point, making a total purse of £100 each round. As a further encouragement, Ford are offering bonuses of £50 for first and £25 for second in all events qualifying for the series.

HEPOLITE-GLACIER Saloon Car Championship

The very popular Hepolite-Glacier Saloon Car Championship, sponsored by AE Auto Parts, of Bradford, which provided such good racing during 1971 continues in 1972 with the prize money increased by £1000.

There are 20 qualifying races, with a driver's best 16 scores counting towards his total. For 1972 there are four capacity classes with the addition of a category for up to 850 cc; the other classes are 851-1000 cc, 1001-1300 cc and over 1300 cc. Points are allocated on the basis of 9 for a class win, 6 for second in class and 4 for third in class, with double points for the final round on October 15.

Prize money in each qualifying round is paid at the rate of £2 per point, which means £18, £12 and £8 in each class and a total race purse of £152. (The same prize money will be paid for the final, double-point round.)

The overall winner of the championship receives £200, while the winners of the other classes will get £72 each. Second place in all classes is worth £40, third place £25, fourth place £15 and fifth place £10. This brings the total pay-out for the championship to more than £3800.


