## Reliving Old Memories

LAST WEEKEND we had the opportunity to see the very latest technology incorporated in modern longdistance sports car racing. Today we turn the clock back several years and have a chance to see not only the type of cars that filled World Championship Sports Car grids some ten years ago or more but also the
marques prevalent in Club racing at that time. Names such as Jaguar, AC, Diva, Aston Martin, MG and marques prevalent in Club racing at that time. Names such as Jaguar, AC, Diva, Aston Martin, MG and Frazer Nash were common sights in race programmes. Nowadays their competition appearances are rare... apart from meetings such as this assembled by the British Automobile Racing Club.
1961 (the "Historic" titles applies to cars prior to this date) and 1968. Thus we will see the same sort of grid that would have assembled for a Marque Sports Car race or a round of the Autosport Series-Produc tion Championship. Take Roger Mac's E-type Jaguar, for example. This car is the very one that Roger used to great effect nearly twenty years ago and is still owned by John Lewis. It is, as ever, beautifully prepared and really is a credit to this new HSCC "formula" which has been in existence only for a couple o seasons.

Mac is likely to have a close battle with the equally delectable AC Cobra of John Atkins - new to racing this year but learning fast - while the twisty nature of the Indy circuit should ensure that the enjoyed some great tussles this year in their respective S3 and S4 models and it was the latter who came out on top in their meeting here earlier in the season.
Event Two is a Qualification race for the Kentagon Championship Formula Ford event. The first four finishers in this race will go forward to make up the rear of the grid for Event Nine
Next up is a race catering solely for MGs: a round of the Collector's Car MGB/C/V8 series, which has enjoyed excellent support this season. Former British Hillclimb champion David Franklin has already tied Terry Osbourne, Rod Longton, Bob Luff, Barry Sidery-Smith and Geoff Gagain. Likely challengers include Marriner look favourites to take their respective standard and road-going modified classes.

The second single-seater race of the afternoon sees a good entry of Formula Junior cars out contesting the final round of their Varley Batteries Championship. Bromley's John Narcisi has already assured himsel of a second successive title having won all bar the first two rounds with his Lotus 20. The Seldon Classic Sports Car Championship seems not to have enjoyed the same support as in recent past seasons but there are stir some very nice cars taking part. Fastest of them should probably be Brian Carty's BMW-engined Elva Mk 8 S, although perhaps Stephen Mitchell will be able to match the Middlesex driver with his nimble Lotus 23 , especially in the absence of reigning champion John Brindley.

Cambridge engineer Brian Turner has virtually assured himself of the Muraspec Touch Fabrics Formula 4 Championship ... and not before time as he has been forced to sit in the shadow of lan Briggs for the past three seasons. Now, with "Briggo" having moved on to FF2000, Brian has taken over at the front and has shown the same kind of domination. He has been challenged by the likes of Cliff Watts, Max SamuelCamsps and Mike Whatley on occasions but Turner has shown an excellent turn of speed, breaking

himself.

The Uher Hi-Fi Thoroughbred Sports Championship is another to have been extremely well supported the car to beat but has recently been vanquished several times by the rapid Aston Martins. Back on a twisty circuit, however, the handling qualities of the TR should prove more advantageous than the Astons power. Patrick Keen seems set to tie up the series with his Morgan +4 , having won his class on all bar one occasion, while the larger standard cars of Bruce Coles (Aston) and Philip Roberts (Austin Healey) should enjoy another close battle that has been one of the hallmarks of the series this year.
Perhaps the most interesting race of all will be the Willhire Historic Special GT Championship enthe winning between them this year and should prove closely matched again today, while the glorious Hyde Vale-prepared Lola-Aston of Peter Millward and David Auger's quick but unreliable Gulf-Mirage should ensure a fascinating race. These cars provided possibly the best era of long-distance racing in the early ' 60 s and are sure to invoke special memories. In the 2 -litre class, Alan Eisner took the chance to gain some winning practice in a special All-comers race here recently and so must start as favourite with his Appolo '
Closing the afternoon is the Kentagon FF1600 qualifier, which has attracted all the usual local runners together with some other drivers looking for some useful practice before the Marlboro World Cup Fomula Ford Festival at the end of next month. Robert Gibbs currently leads the series after some good showing in his Van Diemen RF81, although he can expect a tough time with the likes of Andy Ackerley, Doug Wood and Paul Gerrish breathing up his exhaust. Also in the field is Poole's John Pratt, who has shown well in returns after a lengthy absence to drive David Martin's new Martlett DM4.
