## 12 Chris Irwin

This talented young racing driver must be the favourite for this afternoon's Formula III Trophy Race. Not only has he had an extremely successful season in Formula III racing, but has yet to lose a race at this circuit. He won his first race here in September 1964. On his appearance at the Palace in July last year he won both the heat and the final of the Formula III race, setting up a new lap record in the process. His performance at this year's Whitsun international meeting improved upon this. He won convincingly, beating Piers Courage, the man he considers most difficult to beat in Formula III, and together they established a new lap record. Although this was broken by Chris Williams at last month's meeting, Chris Irwin still holds the race record which he also set up at Whitsun.

Chris, who now drives for the Chequered Flag in Formula III, first started racing for Jim Russell in 1961. He enjoys racing on this small, tight circuit and he has certainly provided Crystal Palace crowds with much enjoyment in the last couple of years.

A Londoner, Chris is aged 24 and unmarried. He was educated at King's School, Canterbury, from where he went to the London College of Printing. Although he recently gave up his job to concentrate on motor racing he still retains an interest in the printing industry. At the moment his racing career is going from strength to strength. He made his grand prix début in splendid style in the RAC British Grand Prix at Brands Hatch on July 16 when he finished seventh.

Chris seems all set for a bright future in motor racing, and this afternoon spectators will have the chance of seeing him in action in both the Formula III and the sports car events - no doubt with his eye on the lost Formula III record.

## Today's Racing

There are six events on today's programme of racing - featuring cars of several different types. The main event of the afternoon is the Formula III Trophy Race for racing single seaters. This race is likely to attract a great deal of attention - not only for the entry - but also because Peter Sellers and his wife, Britt Ekland, are expected to be there to present the trophy to the winner.
In order, presumably, to try to keep the trophy "in the family" Peter Sellers has himself submitted an entry, to be driven by Brian Hart. The Chequered Flag and the Charles Lucas Organisation will both be out in force with three entries apiece. Among the Chequered Flag's entries is a Daf Brabham Ford driven by Mike Beckwith and a Repco Brabham-Ford piloted by Chris Irwin. Neither of these two drivers is a stranger to the Palace. Mike Beckwith's first appearance here was in a sports car race in 1962 and in last Whitsun's big Formula II race he finished overall fifth. Chris Irwin has competed here on several occasions and he has yet to lose a Formula III race on this circuit. Earlier on this year he set up a new Formula III lap record but this was broken by Chris Williams at the Holt Trophy meeting here in July. The two Chequered Flag drivers recently finished in front of the rest of the field in the Formula III race at the Silverstone international meeting.

Chief among their rivals are the Charles Lucas-Team Lotus cars. At the wheel of two of the Lotus-Fords will be Roy Pike and Jack Oliver. Roy Pike is concentrating most of his energies on Formula III racing and he last appeared at the Palace at Whitsun finishing fourth in the Bromley Bowl Race won by Chris Irwin. He has, in fact, been competing here since Formula Junior days and for some time last year he was one of the joint holders of the Formula III lap record. His teammate, Jack Oliver, has had notable successes here in Grand Touring events, appearing only recently in racing cars.

Peter Gethin carried off the Formula III honours at the Holt Trophy meeting in July. On that occasion he beat Harry Stiller, and they will have the chance to resume their rivalry today. Harry Stiller is now lying second in the Les Leston Formula III Championship after leading for much of the season. The present leader in the championship, Chris Lambert, is also competing today. The large and talented entry for this race will undoubtedly make it the highspot of the afternoon.
An interesting variety of cars will be contesting the Norbury Trophy for sports racing cars. The over 1150 class will include three Crossles, three Brabhams, the Lola-Chevrolet of A. Sargeant, as well as a sprinkling of Elvas and Lotuses. Almost all the competitors in the under 1150 class will be in Lotus-Fords; odd man out will be Roger Nathan in his own Costin-Nathan.
In the Anerley Trophy race for Grand Touring cars the Chequered Flag's seven-litre Shelby American Cobra should be very much in evidence in more ways than one. Driven by Chris Irwin, it will come up against the Ferraris of

Piper and Clarke and the Aian Fraser entered Sunbeam Tiger driven by Bernard Unett. After narrowly missing the Autosport championship last year Unett has had a successful season in the new Fraser Tiger. David Piper has been driving Ferraris since 1962 and he won the Norbury Trophy race here in July 1965 in record time. This time was beaten by E. J. Liddell's Ford G.T. in the last meeting held here in July and it will be interesting to see whether the Ferrari can further increase the pace. In the under 1600 class John Miles and John Hine should be well to the fore. John Hine, who will be at the wheel of Chris Barber's Elan, has had frequent outings at the Palace, more usually in sports car events. In fact he holds both the lap and race records for sports cars up to 1150 c.c.
The last Marque Sports car race to be held at the Palace was in September 1961 so it is not surprising that none of the drivers placed then will be seen today. Triumphs, Morgans and Austin-Healeys will be as much in evidence as they were then although the over 3000 c.c. class today is monopolised by E-type Jaguars. S. W. Hands, driving his own Austin-Healey 3000, won the marque sports car race at Goodwood's last meeting of the season, closely followed by two of today's other competitors - Neil Dangerfield (Triumph TR4 SLR) and Jim Donnelly (Morgan Plus Four SLR). Both of these are Chris Lawrence entries and on that outing at Goodwood, Jim Donnelly set up a new lap record.

On a tight circuit like the Palace the saloon races are particularly entertaining. The saloon car event this afternoon will be run in two sections - under and over 1000 c.c. Mike Young will be competing in both races in Superspeed Anglias. Although he has been dogged by bad luck on his last few appearances he has some good performances here to his credit. In the smaller saloon race the Hillman Imps of Roger Nathan and William McGovern should be well up among the host of minis taking part.

The larger saloon race is almost certain to be dominated by Roy Pierpoint in his Ford Falcon, although Jack Oliver may prove a threat. Pierpoint, the reigning British Saloon Car Champion, has had extremely good wins at Silverstone and Brands in the last few weeks. On his last three visits to the Palace he has emerged victorious, beating Jack Brabham at the Whitsun meeting, and he holds both the lap and race records for over 2000 c.c. saloons. Altogether, a varied and entertaining afternoon's racing
