

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
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STAR OF THE WEEK

The details of this race have been settled by a recent meeting of the Board of Control, the qualifiers will be sorted out by speed trials during the Saturday, and these trials force a lot of hard driving, because only the fastest thirty drivers go forward into the big race, but they will get their grid positions according to their times, the fastest will be taking lead positions!!! This will be the first time that this system has been tried out in Formula II Stock Car Racing, the public draw has been shelved for the World Final only. The British Championship will also be over 50 laps, another new innovation for title chasing, all in all the new ideas will make the championship all that more interesting.

Enjoy the sport, cheer clap and whistle, enjoy life by following us around the raceways, and bring a friend, he or she will thank you, so will we.
