
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President's Message

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# New Zealanders on the mark for Grand Prix


Formula Mondial, or Pacific, racing has done more than provide New Zealand with an affordable class of premier open-wheeler racing. It has put New Zealand drivers right on the mark with visiting internationals, and resulted in some of the most competitive motor sport ever seen here.

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Formula 2, or to even consider Formula 1.

If recent form is any guide, a New Zealander will likely lead home today's Grand Prix. Last year David Oxton's Ralt RT4 whirled around the 2.8 km track at an average speed of 175 km/h to set a Pacific lap record of 57.57s. And in official practice, the leading four cars were separated by less than threetenths of a second. In other words, there's not a lot in it.

1983 pole time of 57.32s was set by Dave McMillan's Ralt, and the ex-patriot Kiwi went on to have a



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

This year McMillan is mounting a challenge in the new Alan Burrows-designed and built Dart — a car that is relatively untried. For the first time in recent

years we are seeing a genuine challenge to the all-conquering Ralts.


Born in Christchurch, McMillan is one of the most regular, and popular, visitors to Pukekohe. Aged 38 and single, Dave has been a consistent competitor both in New Zealand and North America, and he won the 1982 US Formula Atlantic series. He has won both the New Zealand and US Formula Ford championships, and won the N.Z. Grand Prix in 1981.

Also Dart-mounted is Brett Riley who did initial sorting of his new car in Britain and Australia. Expatriot Riley, 30, has been living in the U.K. and enters the Grand

Prix under a British racing licence. In recent weeks he has been working hard on preparing his new red and white Dart. "I believe the car has a lot of potential. The Dart should work well once we get it sorted", says Riley.

Brett finished fifth with the car at last month's Pukekohe Gold Star race. He also ran it in the Australian Grand Prix at Calder, near Melbourne, in November. But the Dart was dogged with breaking throttle cables.

Riley is keen to consolidate his racing on local ground. He last raced in the New Zealand international series in 1980 with an ageing March 77B, and finished third

in the 1979 Grand Prix. The Aucklander drove in British Formula 3 racing during the late seventies, and 1980 was the last time he raced on a full-time basis. Riley is aware of the obstacles in making a

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
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

comeback, but is putting a lot of time and effort into his 1984 Just Juice assault.

David Oxton, profiled elsewhere in this programme, must be ranked one of the most likely men to succeed. Like Ken Smith, also Ralt RT4 mounted, Oxton can be relied on to give a polished, exacting performance. Smith, 42, qualifies as the oldest driver in the race, and also the most wily. He showed his form by winning the Gold Star race on December 11, although it was Oxton who posted the best race lap time of 58-41s. Expect times to be faster in the Grand Prix.


Ken Smith has been racing openwheelers for two decades, and has been racing competively for more than half his life. At the last count, Smith could chalk up 23 seasons on the board. He was sixth with a March 722 in the 1973 GP, fifth in 1975 with a Lola T332, and won the 1976 GP, also in the big Lola. Kenny is versatile enough to be quick in any size car, from 1.6 4cylinder to 5-litre V8.

Henderson driver, Paul Radisich, 21, is winner of the revived Motorsport Association "Driver to Europe" award — and a definite top contender for today's Grand Prix. Victory would make Paul the youngest-ever man to win the country's top race. Radisich has



GRANT CAMPBELL - NEW ZEALAND

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
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been keeping in trim by competing in Australian Pacific events during our winter, and arrives fresh for the Just Juice series in a Ralt RT4. This is the same car which took him to third in last month's Gold Star race at Pukekohe. Success today and in later Just Juice events should help send Radisich on his way to Britain and Formula 3 racing in 1984.

Backing up the McMillan racing effort is the Ralt RT4 of Justin Revene, 29, from Miami. And from Britain, is Ian Flux, in the Vacation Inn/Abdex Racing Ralt RT4. Ian

didn't have a lot of luck when he last raced here with a troublesome car; this time he will be much better placed to show his form.

Local driver Eric Morgan has hired an Australian Ralt RT4 that will give him his best-ever chance, while a similar RT4 is entered for Aucklander Grant Campbell. The full entry list was uncompleted when the programme closed for press, and a last-minute with-drawal was Californian Mike Rosen who broke a leg in a domestic accident. But the field still has the makings of a close event, and the form is wide open.

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### OXTON . . . with a Grand Prix win behind him


Auckland's David Oxton is back on the starting grid for the New Zealand Grand Prix again today in a bid to repeat his 1983 winning effort. The experienced 38-year-old took the race that had eluded him last year after being a regular entrant since the sixties.

A second place in the first heat and victory in the second won Oxton his first-ever New Zealand Grand Prix and set the seal on a long-time successful single-seater career. David has five Gold Star national championships under his belt, and was first resident driver home in the 1974, 1977 and 1978 Grand Prix. He finished second in

the 1982 Aurora AFX Formula Pacific championship, and was runner-up to Allen Berg in last season's Just Juice series.

Oxton has consistently dominated Formula Pacific racing in this country, competing as always with dedication and professionalism. In 1981 he not only won the FIA Pacific Region Championship, but the Aurora series and the Union Travel championship.

Born in England, David cut his racing teeth in a Daimler Dart SP250, running with the support and encouragement of father, Steve. He progressed to a 1.5 litre Lola sports car in 1967, dominating

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the small sports car category. Oxton attracted attention with a remarkable drive in a Brabham Twin Cam at the Southland Teretonga circuit during the 1968 international Tasman Cup race. In appalling conditions, he drove superbly to finish first New Zealander.

That year he was second in the 1500 open-wheeler championship, a performance he repeated in 1969. In 1971 and 1972 he was Formula Ford champion, won the Jim Clark trophy and went to Britain in 1972 to represent New Zealand in the World Formula Ford Championship. David qualified on pole in the Brands Hatch event, but crashed in the race itself.


He showed his versatility by campaigning both the Formula Ford Elfin and a Lotus Formula 5000 V8. Drives also included a

destroked formula 1 March-Cosworth V8, and he drove Begg F5000 cars for three seasons. He took one of the Beggs to Britain in 1973 to contest F5000 events.

Oxton's Formula Pacific racing began with a Chevron B29, followed by a B34 and a new Ralt RT4. He has driven in the United States and Australia, and his competition experience includes participation in the Benson & Hedges saloon car series with a Holden Commodore.

As the cars line-up for the 31st New Zealand Grand Prix, spare a thought for the experience of David Oxton, and his long-time support for the nation's premier motor race. He has the backing of a very good team, and when it comes to driving he rarely puts a wrong wheel.

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
# Formula Ford Action

Racing in today's round of the 1983/84 Motorcraft Formula Ford Championship is again expected to be fast and furious. This is one of the oldest classes of racing, yet continues to be one of the best.


Compared with his time last year, Formula Ford's future is more secure. This follows the announcement that Ford of Europe has confirmed continuity of the Kent 1600 overhead valve engine for the formula in the forseeable future. And today's round is one of ten events in what looks to be another closely-fought series.

Jeff Pascoe's two-year-old Formula Ford record of 1m 8.1s went unchallenged at the December Pukekohe round, but the racing was still close and exciting. Christchurch driver John Crawford put on a spirited performance in his Van Dieman, setting fastest practice time of 1m 9.6s, and then taking the lead from Steve Richards (Titan) on the second lap.

Crawford gradually eased away from the dicing Richards and Richard Lester and looked set for a deserving victory. But, coming up to lap a back-marker at the start of the seventh round, the Christ-church driver was involved in a spectacular accident on the fast Champion corner. Both drivers

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were lucky to escape uninjured from the mishap which emphasised the strength of roll cages and full safety harnesses.

Steve Richards went on to win, from Lester, John Murphy and Chris Abbott. You can expect the same men scrapping things out today. It will be worth watching some of the midfield battles, too, in a class of racing that has usually

shown very equal machinery. Crawford and Lester were the fastest qualifiers at the last Pukekohe meeting, and the pace is likely to be even hotter in this round. Expect the best of the Formula Fords to be lapping at an average of around 148 km/h — a swift pace considering the corners and that tricky hairpin at the end of the back straight.

# Ian Flux is back to make amends

A series of problems kept Ian Flux out of the limelight in the 1980 New Zealand Grand Prix but, four years on, the Englishman is back to make amends.

The Ehrlich RP5 he drove that year failed to show race-winning potential, but this time Flux returns with a tried and trusty Ralt RT4. And the 27-year-old, from Guildford in Surrey, is right on form after competing in ten Formula Atlantic races in the UK during the 1983 Northern summer.

lan has shown himself to be a highly competitive racer, with a performance in 1983 which was fast and consistent. He was placed second in the UK Formula Pacific series last year, missing out on the championship by just one point.

Unmarried, Flux has 13 years of motor racing experience to call on, and arrives for the Just Juice Formula Pacific series with a competitive car and three spare engines. He began as a junior mechanic, or "dog's body" as he calls it, for the Graham Hill Racing Team.

lan progressed to Formula Six racing in Britain, and in 1975 was good enough to become Formula Vee Champion in the UK. The next three seasons were spent in Formula 3 racing, finishing second in championships on more than one occasion. Flux has also raced Formula 2 and moved into the Pacific class the year he came to New Zealand.


In 1982 he ran in Formula 2 events, teamed up with Mark Thatcher, but Ian enjoyed more success during 1983. After the Just Juice challenge, Flux intends staying with Pacifics back in the UK, and may also do some saloon car driving.

Meanwhile he is set to have a real crack at the New Zealand races and, on recent form, must be considered one of the men most likely to succeed. Watch the pace of his Abdex Racing/Lep/Vacation Hotels sponsored Ralt . . . it might just provide the surprise.

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# Big saloons shape up for close one

A packed entry of more than 30 cars promises a close second round in the ANZ Bank Touring Car Championship — and the prospect of a Holden versus Ford battle up front. This clash was lacking from the recent Benson & Hedges production saloon series, but the slightly more liberal regulations for the ANZ contest should see new impetus from the Ford stable.

The roarty V8-engined Holden Commodore SS sedans driven by exponents like Robbie Francevic, Warren Midgley and Trevor McLean will be fast and furious, but what about the 351 cubic inch Ford Fairmont of Gary Sprague? And, at Pukekohe last year, the orange Falcon of Wayne Anderson gave an indication of its potential. This car lapped in 1m 10.5s, an average of 143 km/h.

The Motorsport Association of New Zealand executive committee

has accepted a recommendation from the race advisory committee that dispensation be granted to allow the big Fords to use the 351C alloy head as made in the USA. This head is compatible with the Ford 302 and 351 engines and is likely to put the Falcons on a par with the GM machines.

Watch the 5 litre Holden Torana SLR of Peter Meadows and the 5.6 litre Chrysler Charger of Derek MacDonald. Look for the stern battles in the smaller capacity classes, too, for this, the second round in the six event ANZ touring car series. There is interest in the \$30,000 championship from manufacturers like Ford and General Motors. GM, for example, is offering incentive prizemoney for those who do well in General Motors' cars. All cars compete on standard road-going radial ply tyres, rather than expensive racing rub-




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### Close Ford Lasers please crowd

Rising interest in the production Ford Laser Sport class should be typified by the close racing today. A field of 16 starters lines up for the second round of the Laser Sport Championship, a series which includes a prize purse of \$11,000, including \$1000 per event and a final championship stake of \$3000.

Leading names include Warren Hislop — last year's winner — and ex-Shellsport champion, Bryce Platt, top Mini Seven drivers Murray Starnes and Ross Heffernam, top motorcyclist Craig Coleman, plus Ted Jarvis, Phil Horn, Mike Austin and Ron Morgan. Watch for Ed Lamont who did so well at Pukekohe last month, too.

The high standard of car presentation and close but "clean" racing

that characterised last season's series will be maintained with the continuation of the Special Motorcraft Car Care Award at each round, and a strict demerit points penalty for excessive panel damage. Prospective competitors can thus approach the championship confident that racing costs will be minimised to the lowest level possible, and that it is possible to have a successful season's motorsport on almost a break-even basis.

"We are really looking forward to a very exciting championship", say Garry Jackson, Ford's sales manager. "Ford Laser has proven to be the number one selling model in New Zealand, and through the Laser Sport Championship we believe it is going to be a leader in terms of popularity during this motor racing season".

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
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
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# Back to One Race for G.P.

After seven years, the New Zealand Grand Prix title is returned to one race. There are still two heats qualifying for the Just Juice Series, but the premier race title to be awarded only to the 40-lap event which rounds out today's programme.

Since 1978, the New Zealand Grand Prix has been run over two heats. For the 31st Grand Prix, the organisers feel that by putting the emphasis on the longer second event, it will be much clearer who has won New Zealand's most important motor race.

"Because of the guaranteed prizemoney fund and points system, it has been necessary to count both races towards the Just Juice Series", says Eric Mallard, manager of the New Zealand Grand Priz Club. "But the longer second race will be the only event carrying the Grand Prix title".

Former world champion Keke Rosberg, driving a Chevron B34, won the 1977 New Zealand Grand Prix which was the last time the G.P. title was accorded to one long race. That year the event was contested over 58 laps at Pukekohe. Since then two 30-lap heats have been contested, so in actual total distance, the 1984 meeting remains unchanged.

The 1984 Grand Prix is the eighth to be held for 1.6 litre Formula Pacific cars and the 31st in a history which dates back to Australian Stan Jones winning the 1954 Ardmore Grand Prix in the Maybach Special.

It was ten years before the first New Zealander, Bruce McLaren, was able to win the Grand Prix. Yet in the seven years of Formula Pacific racing, three of the Grand Prixs have been taken by New Zealanders.

David Oxton was first in the 1983 Grand Prix, one of six New Zealanders to have won the trophy since the event was instigated.

### Dees battle it out...

Formula Vees are again fighting out honours — but the man to watch is Marton driver, Roger Coles, in the Agfa-Gevaert K.R.D. Elva car. In last month's Dunlop Formula Vee Championship round, Coles came home the victor in both heats.

And at the 1983 Grand Prix meeting, Coles finished second in the first race, finishing only 0.2s

behind Ross Symon, and Roger won the second heat to emerge victor overall. Distinction of Formula Vee lap record (1m 19.2s) is also held by Roger Coles, a time set at this meeting three years ago.

Last season Coles was a clear winner of the Formula Vee Championship, finishing ahead of Ross Symon, Denis Coles and Brett Mudgway. Watch the form today.
