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## COMMENT

Today we welcome as organisers the North Thames Centre of the British Automobile Racing Club. The BARC will be organising four of the Championship Meetings this year - today, May 13th, June 10th and September 9th. The May and June meetings are organised by the Club Headquarters and the others by the North Thames Centre.

The final touches are now being put to the preparations for next weekend's Jubilee International Trophy. As you will have read in the press, the new Ferrari 312B3 is making its world debut here driven by Jacky Ickx. With Jackie Stewart making one of his rare non championship appearances plus the John Player Special, Yardley McLaren, Marlboro BRM, Surtees Fina and UOP Shadow teams and Graham Hill's Shadow, Howden Ganley in the Iso Marlboro and the new Ensign we have a very fine Formula 1 field indeed.

Besides the main race we have full entries for all the other events on the programme and the ingredients for a really first class meeting. There is a very strong overseas entry for the Formula 3 race which is the opening round of the John Player Championship. Of the 60 entries 32 are driven by foreign drivers including the Alpine Renault and Martini teams from France. There is the usual massive entry for the Formula Ford race which is the opening round of the STP Formula Ford Championship and all the leading Group 2 cars and drivers are entered for the British Touring Car Championship Race. In a very fine field for the Historic Car Race there are no fewer than seven 250 F Maseratis entered. The Advance Booking Office is open this afternoon from 16.00 hrs . to 18.15 hrs. in the circuit offices adjacent to the main entrance.

As this will be the Jubilee Meeting we are publishing a special Souvenir Programme which will contain not only details of the meeting but a fully illustrated history of the event including photographs of all the famous drivers that have won the race, the results of all the previous races, the entry list from the first race in 1949 and many other features. It is being printed on art paper and will cost 30 p . It is sure to be a much sought after memento of an historic occasion.

## TODAY'S RACING

High spot on this afternoon's racing is sure to be the Britax Produc tion Saloon Car Championship round which has been divided into two races because of the very large entry received. Of the six races, four are rounds of championships and two are non championship. The other championships are the Blue Circle Modified Sports Car Championship and the Volkswagen (GB) Ltd. Silver Cup Super Vee Championship. The meeting also qualifies for the Vandervell Award for Novice Drivers and the KMS Silverstone Driver of the Year and Driver of the Day Awards.

## Blue Circle Modified Sports Car Race

At the last meeting on March 18th we said that Brian Hough in his TVR was a hot favourite to win. Unfortunately, after setting fastest lap, he spun off at Becketts and retired. Working on the principle that lightning never strikes in the same place twice, we will again select him as favourite but warn everybody to watch car No. 127 (John Evans). John drove a very fine race to win on March 18th and came within one fifth of a second of the class lap record.

Today's race is the second round of the Blue Circle Championship and, as can be seen from the points position on page 11, nearly al the points scorers in the first round are here today. Although Edward Stephens leads the 2001-3000 c.c. class he is sure to find some strong opposition from Syd Segal's Austin Healey 3000. In the up to 1150c.c. class Roger Cowdry looks set to take over the class leadership.

## Formula Ford Race

Although this is a non championship race it has drawn a very good entry. A number of the competitors will be here again next weekend in the Formula Ford Race at the GKN - Daily Express Silver Jubilee International Trophy Meeting. At this stage of the season it is always difficult to assess who will do what as this is the formula in which so many new stars cut their teeth. Looking down the list one spots the name of Geoff Lees (Alexis Mk.18B) who put up some very good performances in races here last season
Britax Production Saloon Car Race ' $A$ '
In this first race the $£ 1050-£ 1500$ and up to $£ 800$ classes are running together. Today's races are the third round of the Britax Championship and again if you refer to page 11 you will find the current positions after the first two rounds. The $£ 1050-£ 1500$ class is very much a Chrysler v General Motors battle with the former having the lead at the moment through Bernard Unett's Hillman Hunter GLS. All five points scorers in this class are entered today so there should be plenty of action as they fight for the lead.
In the up to $£ 800$ class one can expect a duel between the Moskvichs and Minis. With both Bill McGovern and Tony Lanfranchi driving in this class it looks at least like a 1-2 for Moskvich with John Worton's Mini in third spot. Driving Moskvich No. 183 is John Webb, managing director of MCD.

Special Saloon Car Race
Despite being a non championship race, we find quite a number of the Silverstone regulars amongst the entry. Perhaps the thought of KMS Silverstone Driver of the Year points and a $£ 750$ 'bag of gold has something to do with it!
In looking at the entry one suspects that the question will be who will be second to Mick Hill? On past form it will be a fight
between Tony Strawson and Gerry Hazlewood. Unfortunately the entry for class B is rather small and Eric Cook should have no trouble in winning the class. Probable winner of class $C$ is Trevor Cook's Ford Anglia with his main opposition probably coming from the Imps of Mike Kirby and Alistair McHardy. In class D the Imp/Mini battle will probably finish in favour of Richard Belcher.

## Volkswagen (GB) Ltd. Super Vee Race

Although there is only a small entry for this race, due to a clash with the international Formula Super Vee race in Germany, you should see some very fast motoring. These cars can lap the Club Circuit at about the same speed as the Formula 3 cars and are closely matched. As you will see on page 20, there are four joint holders of the class lap record and one of those, Ron Grant, is competing today. One can expect Ron to be up front but you should not overlook the return to Vee racing of Formula 5000 driver, and deep sea diver, Fred Saunders.

## Britax Production Saloon Car Race 'B'

This is where the big cars take the stage. The Camaro/Capri/BMW battle is going to be the highlight of this class of racing this year. Fighting for the lead should be Roger Bell, Richard Lloyd, Gordon Spice and John Brindley with Bell expected to win by a short bonnet unless Richard Lloyd is able to use the extra litres of the Camaro to full advantage down the straights to make up for its lack of speed on the corners. In the other class the Simcas and Ford Escorts will be the main contenders with Ivan Dutton, winner in this class in the first two rounds, hoping for a hat trick.

Tuscan showed that there's no substitute for cubic inches around Silverstone in a Modified Sports Car race by taking an unopposed win in the second round of the Blue Circle Championship. John "Plastic" Pearson's XK120 was never far behind in second place but the surprises came in the class wins when John Evans (Arkracing Elan) beat the previously invincible Jon Fletcher and John Kerswill took the 3 -litre class in. his TVR Tuscan beating Ed Stephens' ex-Hough similar car. Roger Cowdry won the 1150 cc class in his old Ginetta G4. The other major championship being contested was the Britax G1 affair which was split into two races. Class wins in G1 have, unfortunately, become a trifle predictable and the honours were taken by Roger Bell (BMW 3.0 SI), Bernard Unett (Hillman Hunter GLS), Ivan Dutton (Escort Mexico) and Tony Lanfranchi (Moskvich 412). This in no way detracts from the enjoyment, however, as the thrills and spills kept the fair sized crowd highly amused.

Modsports opened the day and a quick glance at the grid was enough to confirm that following the winter's confusion and disagreement over the category the competitors have rallied round and are now producing fine, varied and high-class fields. Last week we speculated whether the Elans would challenge the heavy metal at Silverstone but despite the timekeepers awarding Richard Jenvey ( 1.3 MG Midget) pole position with a 1 m 03.0 s (". . . it was only a 1 m 06.0 s ," protested Richard!) Brian Hough was quickest all through the meeting. John Pearson got his incredible "XK120" well screwed up and only lost 4.4 s on the Richardson motivated Hough through the race, but could not really challenge the TVR. As previously mentioned John Evans had no trouble with the 2 -litre class showing that Ark racing have built a well sorted and very attractive car. Jon Fletcher tried like mad to keep up and indulged in a spin at Woodcote which Chris White (4.7 Tuscan) did well to avoid. Fletcher recovered to take fourth ahead of White's rough sounding and smokey TVR. Dice of the race was between John Kerswill and Ed Stephens in 3 -litre Tuscans. Kerswill powered past Stephens on the last lap to take this class despite fading brakes. After Jenvey's retirement with a split fuel tank the first Spridget home was Bob Neville's 1300 which just held off Andy Bailey's 1150. Bailey took second in class to Cowdry's Ginetta.
Although no championship points were at stake the BARC amassed a field of Formula Fords for a typically close Silverstone dice. After a leisurely start it was Keith Fletcher's Royale RP16 entered by WRA Engineering which forged to the front and pulled out a six second lead over his battling adversaries. The battle for second place kept everyone on their toes as David Heale (Dulon LD9), Colin Emery (MRE 73F) and Irishman Alo Lawlor (Royale RP16) fought a furiously close battle. Eventually Lawlor touched Emery at Becketts and gyrated without loosing a place leaving Emery to nip past Heale in a well judged manoeuvre on the last lap. Equally close for fifth place were Steve Tipping (Royale RP3) and Tim Rathmell (Titan Mk 6) who finished side by side.
The Britax Saloons were split into two races, the first for the up to $£ 800$ and £1050 to $£ 1500$ classes. The rumour that it's all a fiddle so that Lanfranchi gets two drives was officially denied! Bernard Unett showed all how a G1 car really ought to be driven and led into Copse for the first time and that was the last any other competitor saw of him as he pulled away to a convincing win. As the field poured through Woodcote for the first time Peter Slade's Firenza had a frightening roll which also involved Jeff Heselwood's Mexico. Heselwood was able to continue for a lap and Slade only suffered a bump on the head and a severe shaking. Some of the discipline under the yellow flag in ensuing laps left a lot to be desired while the dicing continued. Denis
Thorne (Firenza) and Derek Wileman's

Mexico fought very hard in the later stages of the race, the Firenza just winning despite Wileman's big effort on the last lap. Earlier Derrick Brunt (Firenza) had also diced with these two but spun at Becketts although he fought his way back up to fourth. As seems inevitable Tony Lanfranchi was the easy winner of the small class.
For a while it almost looked as if Tony Hazlewood (Daf-Rover 55) was going to beat Mick Hill's Boss Capri for a special saloon win but after tailing him for five laps Mick slipped by and pulled away to his 62 nd win with the car and broke his two-week-old lap

record in the process. Tony Strawson had held second place for one lap but was unable to keep up with the two leaders and settled for a comfortable third in the Falcon. In a race which had few dices, except for the lead, Eric Cook's demon Cooper S, Trevor Cook's Anglia and Mike Odell's rapid Imp took the class wins. The only nasty incident of the race was when Gerald Kemp in the ex-Merfield Fraud Cortina hit the marshals post at Becketts,

The qualifying round for the Volkswagen

Formula Super Vee Silver Cup can only be described as abysmal. A mere seven cars came to the grid and John Morrison's "Supernora" Tui was so superior to the other runners it was really a non event. Morrison who is the $M$ of $M$ \& $S$, who operate from Goodwood, led all the way in the brand new car which is destined for the United States. Derek Worthington's Royale RP6 held second place early on but spun his chances away on lap six. This left Derek Cook (Hawke) to take second place from Peter Munro (Royale) and Mike Tobitt's Lola T250. A shower late in the race caught almost everyone out a.d the track became very treacherous resulting in a number of moments.

With the track now pretty wet and greasy the remaining two G1 classes came out to close the day's racing. Gordon Spice had the Wisharts Garage Capri on pole and led for the first lap until demoted by Lanfranchi whose BMW was apparenty down on power. Lanfranchi later lost all but third gear and dropped to third place as Roger Bell's similar car running on a mixture of Michelins and Pirellis fought past Spice to the front. These three with the Capris of John Brindley and John Hanson continued to battle very closely eventually finishing with just seven seconds separating the five of them. Les Leston had been carving his way up the field and into touch with these leaders until he lost the tread from one of his rear tyres and had to quit after a sideways moment. Ivan Dutton's Escort Sport took the smaller class but Alan Foster was doing remarkably well with his 1.8 Marina and finished a mere 1.8 s in arrears which surprised a few Marina knockers. For his efforts Bell was awarded the KMS Driver of the Day Award.

Britax Ltd. are internationally renowned for their seats belts, which apart from the vast public market are also supplied to many internationally known racing teams such as Ferrari and Porsche. VOLKSWAGEN (GB) LTD. SILVER CUP CHAMPIONSHIP
Today's race is the first in the Volkswagen (GB) Limited Silver Cup Championship for Super Vee cars. In addition to the 12 National races, drivers have the opportunity to compete on the Continent for the Volkswagenwerk Gold Cup and Castrol GTX Trophy events. Total prize money and travelling expenses for 1973 Championships is around $£ 40,000$.

In the U.K., Minilite, Hewland and Inter Rent (the Volkswagen based car rental service) sponsor Super Vee. This, together with additional trade support, gives a possible first place prize money today of £213.

Super Vee is powered by a specially designed 1600 c.c. Volkswagen engine and produces around 145 b.h.p. For 1973 changes in regulations allow the use of a Hewland type 4 speed gear box, the use of disc brakes on the rear and increasing of the rear wheel minimum width to 8 ins.

With a ready to race car costing around $£ 3,000$, generous prize funds and travelling expenses and times comparable and perhaps even faster than Formula 3, Super Vee offers drivers an exciting and lucrative season of racing.

## VANDERVELL AWARD FOR NOVICE DRIVERS

Following the success of the first Vandervell Award for Novice Drivers in 1972 Vandervell Products Ltd. are again sponsoring this award for 1973. Eligibility to compete will be as before: All competitors at Silverstone who, on or after 1 January, 1973 are holders of an RAC Restricted Racing Licence upon which they have not obtained six upgrading signatures, and have not held a racing licence issued by any National body for more than 12 months.

A slight alteration in the points scoring has been made for 1973. in a race divided into classes or a single class race with less than 10 starters points will be scored on a 8-6-4-2 basis in each class. In a single class race of more than 10 starters points will be scored on a 12-9-6-3-2-1 basis.

Points are scored for a competitor's position relative to all competitors and not just novice competitors. Should a competitor be upgraded during the year he will still be eligible to score points in his races at Silverstone. In calculating the final positions a competitor's best 10 scores will count.

In order to take part in the Vandervell Award, competitors must register with the BRDC Race Office at Silverstone at least 24 hours before the first race in which they wish to be eligible to score points.

The winner of the Award will receive $£ 150$ and the Vandervell Trophy, 2nd £100, 3rd £75, 4th $£ 50$ and 5th £25.

All race meetings at Silverstone between 3 March and 6 October are qualifying meetings for the Vandervell Award.

KMS SILVERSTONE DRIVER OF THE YEAR
Kettering Tyres, the largest Midlands tyre and accessories distributors are entering motor racing sponsorship for the first time in 1973 when they sponsor the KMS Silverstone Driver of the Year and Driver of the

## Day Awards.

The Driver of the Year Award will be open to any driver competing at International or Championship meetings at Silverstone in 1973.
Points will be awarded for each race (but not heats) at these meetings on overall positions as follows: 1st 20 pts; 2nd 15 pts; 3rd 12 pts; 4th 10 pts; 5 th 8 pts; 6th 6 pts; 7 th 4 pts; 8 th 3 pts; 9 th 2 pts; 10th 1 pt. In each race 1 point will also be awarded for the fastest lap in each class with a further point if this fastest lap breaks the existing class lap record.
in the case of two part races points will only be awarded on aggregate placings and aggregate fastest laps.
If it is a long distance race with two drivers sharing the car full points will be awarded to both drivers provided that they have each driven for at least one third of the distance.
Should there be a dead heat for any positions in a race both drivers will be awarded full points for the position.
In the event of a tie, the competitor with the greatest number of wins will be declared the winner. If this fails to achieve the split, other placings will be compared.
A competitor's eight best scores will count.
