## Introducing

## THE JENSEN 541

By Dennis Allen ("Conrod" of the Eastern Evening News)

Pressed by various governments to produce cars in bulk for export, the British motor industry has, with a handful of notable exceptions, been forced to ignore the Grand Turisimo class of vehicle, leaving the field to the continentals. One of the exceptions is the Jensen Motor Company, whose latest product, the " 541 ," is the circuit car for to-day's meeting.

It shows that for grace, power and ingenuity, the Jensen can hold its own against its formidable rivals, and disproves the theory that a British car is rarely attractive unless it is a copy of French or Italian styling.

This 115 m.p.h., four-seater saloon gives exceptional performance with remarkable relative economy through a most favourable power-weight ratio, achieved by marrying a fibre-glass body with the 4-litre, six-cylinder A135 (Austin Princess) engine.

Modifications are available, such as a high-compression cylinder head, but as the standard product possesses enough urge to satisfy most tastes, these are not in great demand

As an indication of the ease with which the Jensen gets its vivid performance, $60 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. requires only $2,000 \mathrm{r} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. and $90 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$., $3,000 \mathrm{r} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. With peculiar modesty, the manufacturers claim 20-24 m.p.g., but $25 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{g}$. at $60 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. averages is common. Overdrive is available as an optional extra, and is fitted to the circuit car.

The chassis is conventional, apart from tubular outriggers and the suspension is the fashionable one of independent front, with semi-elliptic springs at the rear.

## PROGRAMME

The first race will be at 2 p.m. and the meeting will consist of the following events :-
Event 1. 5-lap " All-Comers" Handicap Race for cars with engines not exceeding 2500 c.c. in capacity. Cars fitted with Coventry Climax engines will not be permitted in this race.
Event 2. (a) 10-lap Scratch Race for Sports Cars up to 1100 c.c
(b) 10-lap Scratch Race for Sports Cars 1101 to 1500 c.c.

These cars will run together.
Event 3. 15-lap Scratch Race for Formula III Racing Cars.
Event 4. 15-lap Scratch Race for Unlimited Sports Cars run in three classes :Class (a) up to 1500 c.c.
(b) 1501 to 2700 c.c
(c) over 2700 c.c.

## EXTRACTS FROM THE RACING REGULATIONS

Starting Positions.-Starting positions for Scratch events will, as far as possible, be allotted on practice times.

Flag Signals. -The following flag signals will be used as necessary to signal driver of a car : National-Start. Red-Complete and immediate (waved) (waved)-Great danger, be prepared to stop. Yellow (motionless)-Take care, danger. Blue (waved)-Another competitor is trying to overtake you. Blue (motionless)-Another competitor is following you very closely. Yellow with Verical Red Stripes-Oil on track. White-An ambulance or service car is on the Circuit Black with White Number-Competitor with this number to stop at pit on next lap Black and White Chequered-Signal for end of race.

Instructions to Drivers.-All drivers in Event 1 will report to their machines 20 minutes before the advertised start of the Meeting, henceforth, drivers must report to their cars at the time of the start of the event preceding the one for which they are entered and will proceed to the starting area as directed by the officials. When directed by the Chief Paddock Marshal they shall proceed on to the course and complete one warming up lap prior to taking up their allotted grid positions.

Time signals will be 3 mins., 2 mins., and 1 min., before the start of each event
All drivers must complete 1 extra lap after receiving the chequered flag for the end of the race, before retiring to the Paddock.

The rule of the Road is " keep to the right-overtake on the left."
Outside Assistance - Competitors are warned that outside assistance, save from officials or a car personnel, may render a car liable to disqualification.

VEHICLES are not allowed on the track after the meeting. Visitors shculd leave by their approved routes, or as directed by the stewards.

CROPS Please avoid damage to the valuable crops and farmland around the circuit.

## SPECTATOR SAFETY

In the interest of Public Safety NO PORTABLE STANDS OR CARS are permitted between the spectator ropes, but are permitted in the same position as the car parking area.
