## EXTRACTS FROM THE RACING REGULATIONS

R.A.C. Permit No. R102

Flag Signals.-The following flag signals will be used as necessary to signal the driver of a car : National-Start. Red-Complete and immediate stop. Yellow (waved)-Great danger, be prepared to stop. Yellow (motionless)-Take care, danger. Blue (waved)-Another competitor is trying to overtake you. Blue (motionless)-Another competitor is following you very closely. Yellow with Vertical Red Stripes-Oil on track. White-An ambulance or service car is on the Circuit. Black with White Number-Competitor with this number to stop at pit on next lap. Black and White Chequeved-Signal for end of race.

Outside Assistance.-Competitors are warned that outside assistance, save from officials or a car pit personnel, may render a car liable to disqualification.

R-Red, G-Green, Gy-Grey, L-Lilac, M-Maroon, Wt Bl Str.-White with Blue Stripes, S-Silver, G \& S-Green \& Silver, Blk-Black, B-Blue, U-Unpainted, A-Aluminium, P-Purple, DB-Dark Blue, BG-Black-Green, St-Stone, C-Crimson, Wt-White, B/G-Beige/Green, G/R-Green/Red, T-Turquoise, G/Y-Green/Yellow.
