

Club House at the Circuit. In addition to the above items, a monthly news letter is sent out to all members giving details of our activities, and items of news, posters, carstickers, etc., are also

sent to all members.

This is a live, active club, and does, we feel, offer the Snetterton race-goer excellent value for his £1 or 30s., whichever the case may be; our steadily increasing membership does, I think, verify this.

We would welcome YOU as a member.




