

CHAMPIONS PARADE FOR EASTER

Good afternoon and a Happy Easter. Today's meeting is organised by the East Anglian Centre of the BRSCC and is our first car race meeting of the new season.

What a champion line up we have too. Three National Championships get under way in a programme of six races - five of them for various Championships - and the entry in-

a programme of six races - five of them for various Championships - and the entry includes several 1979 champions.

There is no doubt that the ever-popular Formula Fords top of the bill in the first round of

fourteen, for the Townsend Thoresen Championship, a fifteen lap race with a top class

entry of 60 hopefuls competing for a maximum of 26 places on the grid. Local manufacturers Van Diemen are strongly represented by no fewer than sixteen of their models. Brazilian Roberto Moreno and Irishman Tommy Byrne, both in RF80s, have battled round nearly every British circuit you can name and there is no reason why it should not be the same again this afternoon. Also in RF80s are 1979 Dunlop "Star of Tomorrow" Guy Dormehl and young Robert Gibbs from Sittingbourne who, when he's not racing is studying Building Technology at South Bank Polytechnic, London. At the time of writing a further Van Diemen RF80 is entered for a driver yet to be named,

At the time of writing a further Van Diemen RF80 is entered for a driver yet to be named I wonder if we shall see either of the two promising Brazilians Raol Boesel or Fernando Ribeiro in the "spare" car.

Meanwhile our friends from Wymondham, Rushen Green Racing, are set to field a quartet of Royale RP26s led by racing Doctor Jonathan Palmer from Heathfield, Sussex. Many will remember Jon's efforts a few seasons back in a Modified Sports Marcos, and he is now firmly established as one of the leading drivers in Formula Ford. Palmer will be well supported today by 18 years old Julian Bailey, Swiss driver Mario Hytten and David (no relation) Palmer.

American Peter Argetsinger enjoyed a fine race and a narrow victory over Londoner Ashley Ward at Brands Hatch on 15th March and these two should again renew battle in Royale RP26 and Ray 80F respectively. Mike Thompson, from Maidstone, is entered in the extremely interesting Quest FF80 - an entirely new shape to formula ford - which has shown immense potential in early races this season and rapid improvement must surely be on the cards. Look out too for the two new red Spartons from the Surrey based firm due to be driven by Martin Holman (Kent) and Allen Revell (Sussex).

Others capable of being right up with the leading bunch are former Grovewood award winner and Formula Ford Festival winner in 1979 - Don MacLeod (Sark 2), Tony Trevor, Andy Ackerley, Dave Hoban and Geoff Davies. With such a high quality field anything could happen and anyone could win.

Two separate practice sessions in the morning will determine the fastest twenty-four who will automatically qualify for the Townsend Thoresen race, while the remainder will fight it out in the opening BRSCC Challenge race over ten laps

A brand new racing category for 1980 is introduced by Ford today - the Debenham's Ford Rallye Sport Fiesta Challenge. Ford ran the first ever one make series, back in 1971, for Escorts and this form of competition - where drivers compete on virtually equal terms-invariable provides spectacular fun for all concerned.

Many "one make" protagon ists have switched to this new formula for 1980 and two of last year's "one make" champions meet here today for the opening round. Surrey based removal specialist Jim Edwards (1979 Renault 5 Challenge) and Steven Soper (1979 Mini 275GT) should both be well to the fore. While former Escort racers, Chris Knight, Stuart Cole, and David Grimshaw will compete against former Renault 5 Challenge drivers - Roger Jones and Dave Loudon. The lone lady in the race is Vivien Ayres who acquitted herself extremely well in last year's Fiesta 1300 Ladies' Challenge. George Turton was testing at Brands recently and if his three-wheeling antics are anything to go by today's race should be hectic to say the least!

The second round of the exciting new Rolatruc 1600 Production Saloon series sees everybody's favourite Tony Lanfranchi heading the entry in one of two Mayfair VW Sciroccos. The other is to be dirven today by David Cunningham from New Zealand who is a professional singer. David has put up some startling performances recently and is improving with every race in this his first full season. In 1979 David won the Motor Racing Stables' esteemed driver's champion ship.

Nick Baughn's equally tidy VW Scirocco should again prove to be a force to be reckoned with as, no doubt, will the two Renault Gordinis of Neil McGrath and Jim Edwards. McGrath dominated the Renault 5 Challenge, winning in 1974, '75, '76 and '78 while Edwards won in '79. If the opening round at Mallory Park a fortnight ago can be used as a form guide these fellows don't ask and don't give an inch!

Steven Soper appears again in the opening round of the BRSCC Modified Sports Car Race. this time with the fleet Radbourne Racing Fiat X 1/9. Although it is, perhaps, unlikely that Soper will challenge for the lead - there are two 145mph Porsche Carreras entered for Dudley Wood and Tony Wingrove - the sheer speed of the red and green flying Fiat has surprised plenty of larger engined cars already this season.


Another small engined car which may be among the 'bigger fish' is the 1147cc Imp engined Davrian of John Pugsley and, if all goes well, he should be up with the Lotus Elans of Paul Berman and Pat Thomas who will be aiming to uphold the honour of that factory down the road!

Finally there is a ten lap race for Clubmans Register cars. These are rapid front engined sports-racing cars with modified engines up to 1700cc. Local driver David Orbell, from Cambridge, may have his work cut out to stay ahead of the two Ardmore Racing Mallocks, Michael Dixon, and the Gryphon which is to be driven by Sid Marler or Richard Groombridge. Silver dealer Tony Pouyanne has entered his attractive Silver Phantom and he showed the car's capabilities on several occasions last season.

So, all in all, a good day's racing in prospect. A glance through your 1980 Fixture Book - and I know you have all go one by now - will give you a fair idea of what's in store this year. One day particularly to note is June 21/22 when Britain's first ever 24 hour race will be staged here. A full programme of supporting activities is currently being organised and it should make a great day (and night) out for the whole family.

Nearer to hand though is Easter Monday here when Snetterton features a National Motorcycle Road Race meeting with practice from 9.30 and racing due to start at 1.00p.m.


Terry Nightingale meets Sam Cleps at the Esses during a "Clubmans Register" Race

SNETTERTON CIRCUIT TO HOST BRITAIN'S FIRST 24-HOUR ENDURANCE MOTOR RACE.

Prestigious new motor sporting event for East Anglia's own racing track.

Britain is to have its first ever 24-hour motor race this year, to be held on Midsummer weekend. June 21-22

The race will be open to both saloon and sports cars and will be held at Snetterton Circuit, Norfolk - the only track in the country with the necessary planning permission for this type of event.

Sponsored by Willhire, who operate a car and van rental service based in East Anglia, the race will be called the Willhire 24 Hours and will be organised by the British Racing and Sports Car Club on behalf of Motor Circuit Developments.

Snetterton is the logical location for such a race, it being the only circuit in the country to have any recent experience of running races in the dark. Last year, the track hosted a round of the Tricentrol British Saloon Car Championship, which was of hours duration and run completely at night-time. It proved to be very successful and high-lighted the need in this country for a real test of endurance.

Prior to that event, night races were held at the circuit as part of the BRSCC-run Tour of Britain between 1973 and '76, while, going back even further, the Autosport 3 Hours race provided an annual end-of-season event - the final round of the Autosport-backed Sports GT Championship - in the late '50s and '60s, which started in daylight but finished after dusk. Jack Sears won the last of these in 1964 with his AC Cobra, the racing having to be stopped slightly early due to dense fog, although the event was run to a slightly different format the following year with a couple of 2-Hour races.

COMMANDER'S CUP


At Snetterton, however, a 24-Hour test of stamina and endurance is performed from time to time as drivers strive to compete for the 'Commander's Cup'. This is not a race as such but is run as a challenge to see who can complete the most miles at Snetterton in a production car within 24-Hours.

The history of the Commander's Cup goes back to one summer's evening in 1965 when Commander Philip Heseltine, a long-time supporter of the local centre of the BRSCC, and motor sport in general, went to the circuit to find that Jim Russell had just completed a 24-Hour run in a Vauxhall Victor. After a couple of drinks, the Commander asked Russell whether he would like a cup to commemorate his achievement!

In the early days, a challenge was laid down for anyone to cover more miles with a production car which must cost less than £1,000. Inflation, of course, has changed all that but the Cup is still open to be won by a driver or team of drivers running a production car and is currently held by Andy Rouse, Tony Dron and Win Percy, who covered 1855.5 miles in a Porsche 924. The Willhire 24 Hours provides an exciting extension to the Commander's Cup theme and is sure to capture the imagination of both competitors and spectators, coming, as it does, just a week after the classic Le Mans 24 Hour sports car race in France.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE

Spectators at Snetterton on June 21/22 will be able to take advantage of a two days-for-the-priceof one ticket, costing £3.00, which will allow admittance to either or both days and enable spectators to watch the start of the race on Saturday together with a couple of supporting events, and then return again on Sunday to witness the climax of the 24 Hours, suitably refreshed after a good night's sleep! Some of the drivers will be wishing that they could do just the same, no doubt!
